

Cadet Endowment Fund Scholarships Criteria

The Cadet Endowment Fund was created through donations with the primary purpose of supporting cadets to receive flight training leading to a pilot's license. The endowment fund committee, composed of former Wing Commanders, has the ability to provide grants to individual cadets and units in support of Cadet Programs.

Cadet Flight Scholarship Program

The Cadet Flight Scholarship Program provides up to \$5000 (depending on the growth of the account each year) which can be used for local flight training at a fixed-base operator (FBO) or training on CAP aircraft with a CAP instructor. (FAA part 61 or 141). Please note that it is expected that a cadet will make every attempt to set up training with a CAP instructor and aircraft first before looking at other training options.

- ❖ Basic Requirements to be eligible
 - Wright Brothers or above recipient
 - Must be able to show active participation and promotion in the Cadet Programs in the past year
 - Encampment graduate
 - Participation in at least one group, wing, region, or national activity in past year
 - At least 14 years old at time of receiving the scholarship
 - Have a Third Class Medical Certificate and valid student pilot certificate with TSA background check.
 - NOTE: You are not required to have these at the time that you apply. If selected, you will have to send copies of both certificates in order to claim your scholarship.
- ❖ Application Process
 - Cadet scholarship applications are due 90 days prior the Missouri Wing Conference each year
 - Applications must be submitted through the cadet's appropriate chain of command to the Missouri Wing Director of Cadet Programs who will submit applications to the designated Endowment Fund Committee member
 - NOTE: The committee asks that the squadron commander and Director of Cadet Programs provide a short endorsement of the cadet requesting the scholarship.

Cadet Activity Unit Grants

The committee will consider providing grants up to \$500 that can be used for units representing the Missouri Wing at regional or national level activities or competitions.

- ❖ Application Process
 - Email to the Cadet Endowment Fund Committee
 - Submitted from the unit through their appropriate chain of command to the Director of Cadet Programs
 - This can be done at any time, but is requested at least 60 days prior to the event
 - Information that must be submitted to the committee for consideration
 - Name and short description of the activity which cadets/unit representing Missouri Wing
 - Why the funds are needed/requested
 - Dates of the activity
 - Explanation of how funds are to be spent
 - Amount requested
 - Endorsement of the Director of Cadet Programs (This will be provided by the CP when they forward on the email to the committee.)
- ❖ NOTE: Upon completion of activity or as money is spent, units will submit receipts IAW CAPR 173-1.
